- 4:30 PM Coach arrives for loading.
- 5:00 PM Depart **Northland High School** via **deluxe air conditioned motor coach with DVD**. (13 hours have been allotted for drive time plus 2 hours for dinner on your own, driver change, and breaks.)

- 8:00 AM Arrive in **Boston** and have **breakfast** at the **Hard Rock Café**.

- 9:00 AM Enjoy a **guided tour** of beautiful and historic **Boston**. Explore Boston's **Freedom Trail** including **Beacon Hill**, the **State House**, **Park Street Church**, **Old Granary Burial Ground**, **Colonial Boston**, Site of the **Boston Massacre**, **Faneuil Hall**, **Quincy Market**, **North End**, **Paul Revere's House**, and **Old North Church**.

- 1:30 PM Tour **Fenway Park**, home of the Boston Red Sox! Though generations have come and gone, Fenway Park remains, much like it did the day it opened on April 20, 1912. Get a behind-the-scenes look of America's most intimate ball park. Since 1912, the Red Sox have won five World Series most recently in 2004, ending one of the longest droughts between championships in Major League Baseball history.

- 3:00 PM Experience the **New England Aquarium**. One of the city's most popular attractions, get personal with three species of penguins, harbor seals, and many other creatures of the deep. The vast 200,000 gallon Giant Ocean Tank is the aquarium's centerpiece, where an upward-spiraling walk-way guides you around the ecosystem.

Thursday, April 8

- 9:00 AM Transfer to Salem, Massachusetts. (45 minutes have been allotted for drive time.)
- 10:00 AM Arrive in **Salem**, where you will meet your guides to take a **short walking tour**, visiting the **Nathaniel Hawthorne House**, the **Counting House**, the **Colonial Revival Gardens**, and the beautiful **waterfront**, on your way to **The House of the Seven Gables** (also known as the **Turner-Ingersoll Mansion**). When you arrive professional guides will warmly greet you for an unforgettable historical experience. Outside, spectacular seaside gardens await you. Inside, discover a mysterious secret staircase where you least expect it! Built in 1668, this is the oldest surviving 17th century wooden mansion in New England, and houses more than 2,000 artifacts and objects, more than 40 framed works, 500 photographs and glass plate negatives, and more than 650 volumes in our research and rare book library. It is most famous for inspiring author Nathaniel Hawthorne to write his legendary novel of the same name.

- 12:30 PM Explore the **Witch Museum**, where you are given an overview of the Salem Witch Trials of 1692. Follow the history of witches, witchcraft and witch hunts through the ages.

- 2:30 PM Explore the **USS Constitution & Museum**, the oldest commissioned warship afloat in the world, first launched in 1797. It is one of six ships ordered for construction by George Washington to protect America's growing maritime interests. The ship's greatest glory came during the war of 1812 when she defeated four British frigates which earned her the nickname "Old Ironsides," because cannon balls glanced off her thick hull.

- 3:30 PM Visit the **Bunker Hill Monument**. Standing 221 feet tall at Breed's Hill, it is the site of the first major battle of the American Revolution fought on June 17, 1775. While here, climb the 294 steps that lead to the pinnacle. There are no elevators in the monument; however, the amazing vista at the end of the journey is well worth it.
